This Sunday's focus in the Anabaptism at 500 Commemoration is "Renewal through Repentance: Repenting of our failures and sins as Anabaptist families of faith." We fall short of who we're called to be as followers of Jesus. A phrase repeated often in early Anabaptist spiritual writings was "Bend the knees of my heart." Repenting and being sorry for our sins, witting or unwitting, should motivate a persistent curiosity about our failures to live what we profess, along with creative new ways to amend our lives in solidarity with the body of Christ. When we humble ourselves, seek God's face, and turn from our evil ways, the Holy Spirit ministers to us, and God forgives our sins, renews our communities, and heals our lands.
