The theme for today, Palm Sunday, is Christ Collides with Our Expectations. The disciples believed that Jesus was the Messiah, the real king who would put an end to Roman rule through military force. To the Pharisees, Jesus was a

troublemaker who blasphemed God, falsely claimed to be God, and claimed to have God's authority. They believed they still had control over him. The people expected everything to continue as usual, without any disruptions. Some hoped that life would remain comfortable, while others likely felt hopeless, as if the status quo they were locked out of would never change. Expectations were about to be upended by the collision of Christ's reality. We can learn to develop better expectations through increased knowledge and experiences with Christ. How can we develop an expectation that Christ's reality will surprise, collide, and transform us?

Lent themes so far: Christ Collides with Our... Bias, Condemnation, Priorities, Selfishness, Blinders, and Expectations.

Luke 19:29-42 NIV

29 As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 30 "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. 31 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.'"

- **32** Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. **33** As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?"
- 34 They replied, "The Lord needs it."
- **35** They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. **36** As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.
- **37** When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:
- 38 "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"[a]

"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

- **39** Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"
- **40** "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."
- **41** As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it **42** and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes.
